In August of 2021, my family had to say goodbye to Ed Stewart, a wonderful, God-fearing, hard-working, humble American Veteran, amazing father, caring brother, proud papaw & great papaw, fun-loving uncle, ornery cousin, and loyal friend after a long battle with CLL, a form of leukemia caused by Agent Orange during his time in Vietnam, where he served in the U.S. Army as a tank commander in the late 60's.

His late wife, Elizabeth Stewart, loved the Christmas season and always made it a magical experience with decorations and presents. For 12 years after her death, we continued to put her tree up in her honor which brought great joy to Ed. However, in 2019, during a stay at the VA Hospital, a Christmas tree they had on display caught his eye and he and his lady friend set out to find it online. In doing so, he did not actually find the tree he was looking for but stumbled upon the Patriotic American flag Christmas tree. He called, very excited, asking that I order the tree for him. He displayed it proudly for 2 years before his passing, even crowning it with his Donald Trump hat as a tree topper! We decided to display both parents' trees together in 2021 as a way to honor their memories. Upon posting photos of our evening of decorating on Facebook, Jennifer Lowe reached out inquiring about the uniqueness of the patriotic tree. We tossed around ideas about donating the tree to the Festival of Trees but ultimately decided our family would keep the tree, sponsor a space for the event and decorate it as a family. There were many aspects of the decorations that were intentional and held great meaning. Ed taught us through his example, to take pride in the freedom of our country, to always show respect to those who have served or are serving, and to donate and shop locally for the betterment of our community. Our goal was not only to raise funds for the beautiful historical building, the Masonic Cornerstone, but also to pay homage to our military men and women past and present. It seemed fitting when we came across his military uniform to have a second tree, with his hat as the tree topper, saluting all the men and women who have taken pride in service to our country and those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms we are blessed to have today. Toy soldiers adorned the smaller saluting tree. We were overwhelmed by the response of the community as they were asked to write the name and branch of their soldier or veteran on a star ornament and hang it on the tree. They were instructed to take a toy soldier from the tree and

put it in a prominent place in their home to be reminded to pray for those serving and their families. With more preparation, we would like to make Ed's unique Patriotic tree even more interactive. We asked people to sign up to have a custom ornament made with their loved one's photo, rank, branch, etc. to hang on the tree in the 2023 Festival of Trees. As a result of this opportunity, we will be brainstorming in the coming months for a service project to not only honor soldiers and veterans but also give back in a heartfelt, meaningful way in loving memory of Ed Stewart to keep his light burning bright for as long as we are able.
